If you are eligible to claim Employment expenses and you are using the detailed method, you will have received a T2200 from your employer. Depending on how the form is filled out, there any many different expenses each person is allowed to claim. The List below is a guideline to get you started, you may have more or less expenses than listed below. (Don't forget to go through the regular appointment checklist).
